## **Creation of the NIA Working Group**



- ☐ Created by mandated of the Committee of Experts in **decision 3/104** (E/C.20/2013/5/Add.1) at its 3<sup>rd</sup> session (July 2013)
- The objective is to identify **best practices** and **sets of institutional models** and legal frameworks for national geospatial information management.
- ☐ Consists of representatives from **11 Member States**:
  - 1 Columbia
  - 3 Japan
  - 5 Mongolia
  - 7 Pakistan
  - 9 Singapore
  - 11 Tuvalu

- Jamaica
- México
- Nigeria
- Republic of Korea
- 10 Spain

☐ In March 2014, **Spain was elected as chair** of the Working Group



## Terms of Reference of the Working Group

- ☐ Included:
  - the Working Group's **objective**
  - expected results
  - specific activities to be achieved
  - membership and composition
  - reporting procedure
  - frequency of **meetings**
  - the **Secretariat's role** and responsibilities

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## **National Institutional Arrangements**

## The **proposed** definition:

☐ National Institutional Arrangements for GIM may be defined as :

"Formal and informal cooperation structures that supports and links public and private institutions and or organizations, and which are used to establish the legal, organizational and productive frameworks to allow for sustainable management of geospatial information, inclusive of its creation, updating and dissemination, thereby providing an authoritative, reliable and sustainable geospatial information base for all users."

## Work Plan and Road Map - 1



#### ☐ A draft 2014- 2015 Work Plan based on three areas of work

#### 1. Geospatial Information Business Model Analysis

Analysis of geospatial information production systems, funding structures, dissemination systems and data policy models for geospatial information.

#### 2. Structure of Geospatial Information Management Organizations

Analysis on the type of entities, organizational structures, leadership styles, governance, policies and legislation and linkages between entities and their communication mechanisms

#### 3. The Role Of People As Users And Producers Of Geospatial Information

Analysis on the role of citizens as active stakeholders in geospatial information production and the impact of volunteer geographic information and crowd sourced data

## Work Plan and Road Map - 2



- ☐ Three sub-groups are to be created
- ☐ The proposed sub-groups are:
  - **1. Working Group 1**: Geospatial information production systems analysis.
  - 2. Working Group 2: Geospatial information funding structures, dissemination systems and data policy models.
  - **3. Working Group 3**: Structure of Geospatial information management organizations and the role of volunteered geographic information.
- The work of each sub-group will be led by a Coordinator

  Responsibilities are: organizing tasks, fostering participation and recruiting new members from the global geospatial information community





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## Work Plan and Road Map - 3

- ☐ A Road Map has been prepared in line with the tasks outlined in the Work Plan
- ☐ 3 key dates and related milestones have been highlighted
  - August 2014
  - December 2014
  - year 2015
- ☐ Work Plan and Road Map have been circulated among WG members for comments, which have been included in updated versions.
