**Deqing International Seminar on
United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management

Deqing, Zhejiang Province, China, 27 – 28 September 2018**


It is estimated that 70% of the world's people-to-land relationships are not documented, recorded or recognized. Effective and efficient land administration and management is needed to accelerate efforts to document, record and recognize people-to-land relationships in all its forms. With these challenges, coupled with the lack of geographic coverage of formal land administration systems, the theme of the Deqing International Seminar is 'Effective Land Administration'. The Seminar will provide a unique and supportive platform for the geospatial community and a diverse group of stakeholders to engage one another and discuss priority issues related to fit-for-purpose land administration and management. Effective land administration provides all people with better access to, and security of, land and property rights, can mitigate issues relating to land as a root cause triggering conflict, and to 'leave no one behind', the overarching principle of the 2030 Agenda.

We request you and/or your senior officers from your organization to attend and contribute to the Deqing International Seminar. We also ask that you share this information with relevant government agencies and organizations in your country in the effort to inform a wide cross-section of related communities, policy-makers and stakeholders.
