The PAIGH, together with the National Geographic Institute of Spain, National Geographic Information Center, funded and facilitated a 6-week Metadata E-Course Training for Belize National Spatial Data Infrastructure (BNSDI) stakeholders across the government and non-government organizations. The course was requested by the Ministry of Natural Resources (BNSDI Office). The training commenced on April 6th and concluded May 22nd, 2020. The course was fully online, with a methodology that allowed each participant to take the course anywhere and adapt the schedules to each participant's needs. At the end of the course, 67% and/or 21 persons completed the course. The top 5 performers, in no particular order, were from Ministry of Natural Resources, Ministry of National Security, National Meteorological Service, Belize Telemedia Limited and University of Belize.
