Statement:

Jamaica takes note of the present report and the overall work of the Subcommittee on Geodesy. Commendations are extended for the notable progress and achievements of this Subcommittee. In light of the effects of the global pandemic (COVID19), Jamaica duly recognizes the adjustments made by the Subcommittee in the execution of its agenda. Jamaica envisions that the Subcommittee will continue to make great gains in the execution of its schedule; the development and implementation of the Global Geodetic Reference Frame (GGRF).

Of particular note are the gains made in the focus area of Education, Training and Capacity Building; as one can appreciate that the outcomes of this working group underpins fundamental initiatives in the development of geodetic infrastructure for Small Island Developing States (SIDS). Jamaica fervently supports capacity and skills development initiatives as it is a critical element to the development of a Nation's geodetic infrastructure; the development of the human resource aspect.

The objectives of these two draft documents seek to comprehensively guide SIDS in the development and sustainability of its geodetic infrastructure; promoting best practices as well as connecting with the international geodetic community.

Jamaica takes note of the offer from the Federal Republic of Germany to host a Global Geodetic Centre of Excellence (GGCE) in Bonn; Jamaica fully supports this offer. Additionally, Jamaica encourages Member States and relevant geodetic stakeholders to contribute to the establishment and sustainability of the GGCE as its development will fundamentally further unlock a Nation's growth and prosperity.
