SIDE EVENT Fundamental Geospatial Data Themes

BACKGROUND

At its fifth session, the Committee of Experts adopted decision 5/103, in which it agreed that there was an urgent need for a set of global fundamental geospatial data themes that could be harmonized in order to enable the measurement, monitoring and management of sustainable development in a consistent way over time and to facilitate evidence-based decision-making and policymaking. The Committee of Experts supported the initiative proposed by UN-GGIM: Europe to establish and lead a working group to liaise with the other four regional committees in order to bring together information on the consideration of fundamental geospatial data themes and to lead discussions between interested Member States and observers, with a view to developing an agreed minimum set of global fundamental geospatial data themes.

OBJECTIVES

This side event will review the context for the Working Group, its Terms of Reference, Work Plan and progress to date. The meeting will then be presented with the current thinking of the Work Group on fundamental data themes. There will be discussion with the aim of coming to a consensus on the themes to be included. The meeting will conclude by considering next steps.
