Objectives

The side event is organized by Esri, in collaboration with UNSD, to inform Member States delegates and Observers as to the value of the Integration of Statistical and Geospatial Information. In the coming years, National Mapping Agencies and National Statistical Organizations will be engaged in collecting more and more in-situ information. Drivers for this largely due to the forthcoming 2020 Round of the Census whereby essential demographic and population data will be collected; improved positional information on handheld devices; and the requirements for the Sustainable Development Goal Data Indicators – as much of this data needs to be collected at the household or district level. Further analysis and aggregation of this in-situ data will result in better sustainable development solutions.
