The Fifth High Level Forum aims to substantively improve and strengthen the national geospatial information management capacities of countries, particularly developing countries, towards implementing the 2030 Agenda and evidence-based policy and decision making. Objectives of the Forum will be to discuss the integration of geospatial knowledge, platforms and services to facilitate informed decision making, empowering people for better sustainable management and development of the Earth's finite resources. This will enable and drive national government agencies, multilateral and international development organizations, the commercial sector, academia and civil society to pursue sustainable development using geospatial knowledge and services. It will also continue to raise political awareness and highlight the importance of these technologies to decision makers.

The Forum will be substantively supported by each of the Regional Committees of UN-GGIM, including for: Africa (UN-GGIM: Africa); Asia and the Pacific (UN-GGIM-AP); the Americas (UN-GGIM: Americas); Europe (UN-GGIM: Europe); and the Arab States (UN-GGIM: Arab States), as well as the UN-GGIM Private Sector Network, the UN-GGIM Academic Network and the UN-GGIM Geospatial Societies.
