## **UN-GGIM 2015 Map/Poster Exhibition Guidelines**

## 5<sup>th</sup> Session of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management 5-7 August 2015 UN-GGIM 2015 MAP/POSTER EXHIBITION GUIDELINES

## **THEME:** Geospatial Information Underpinning Sustainable Development

National mapping/geospatial organisations of United Nations Member States are invited to contribute to the UN-GGIM 2015 map/poster exhibition, showcasing the theme *Geospatial Information Underpining Sustainable Development*.

#### BACKGROUND

At its Fourth Session in August 2014, the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) endorsed the International Map Year (IMY) 2015-2016, as a valuable means to promote the importance of maps and geospatial information globally, E/C.20/2014, (Decision 4/111). It is in recognition of this endorsement, and the value of geospatial information and maps to sustainable development that the UN-GGIM Bureau and Secretariat will be staging this map/poster exhibition.

The map/poster exhibition is being convened as a pre-cursor to a larger exhibition the Secretariat wishes to stage in recognition of the IMY in 2016. This activity is also in line with the UN-GGIM work item, which requires the demonstration and promotion of the importance of reliable geospatial information to measure and monitor the goals of the post-2015 development agenda.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

It is hoped that national mapping/geospatial organisations will consider this invitation as an opportunity to contribute to the UN-GGIM work item and the overall sustainable development agenda. Importantly the objective is to sensitise and raise the awareness on the importance of maps and geospatial information to the management of global resources and the monitoring of sustainable development goals.

The exhibition is to be held during the 5th Session of the Committee of Experts, the week of August 3-7, 2015. The exhibition will be located in the United Nations Secretariat Building and accessible to all participants attending the fifth session of UN-GGIM, and to others visiting/using the conference facilities.

#### **AUDIENCE**

These will be your fellow session participants, United Nations staff, representatives of Permanent Missions, and visitors to the UN. This infers that the maps and/or posters should be clear and able to be understood by the ordinary citizen and not just geospatial experts.

#### **EXHIBIT AREA**

The maps and posters submissions must depict one or a combination of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). They are to be one standard size (see below), and accompanied with written explanations. It is expected that the exhibit area will be orgainsed in sustainable development goal groupings as follows:

- Area 1 SD Goal 1-5
- Area 2 SD Goal 6-9

- Area 3 SD Goal 10 12
- Area 4 SD Goal 13-17

#### **EVALUATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF MAPS/POSTERS**

Prior to the exhibition, all of the maps/posters will be reviewed by the UN Statistics Division and the UN Cartographic Section for applicability to the theme, guidelines and to ensure there are no political sensitivities or disputes contained in them. The maps/posters selected will be included in the UN-GGIM knowledge base, featured on the front page of the UN-GGIM web site, and in any other promotional activity related to geospatial information supporting sustainable development.

## MAP/POSTER REQUIREMENTS FORMAT

Contributions will be limited to one map/poster per national mapping/geospatial organization, which may be an individual or a series of maps, depicting how geospatial information supports sustainable development, with special reference to the SDGs (See below). The maps/posters submitted should be in line with the following:

- i. Appropriate cartographic elements, (neat line, title etc.)
- ii. The total dimensions should not exceed 0.8m wide x 1.5m high (approximately 30 in. x 60 in.).
- iii. Must have a brief descriptive note on the objective/purpose and applicability to sustainable development.
- iv. *Format:* pdf or jpg files; *File size:* should not exceed 10 Mb if sent by e-mail. Maps/posters may also be uploaded to a FTP site (address to be made available at a later date). Files submitted via FTP should not exceed 1Gb.
- v. The UN-GGIM Secretariat will print the maps/posters submitted for exhibiting.
- vi. *Deadline for submission*: 22 June, 2015 (to enable review, selection and printing by UN-GGIM Secretariat).

Member States wishing to submit printed maps/posters must ensure that they are mailed to the UNSD/UN-GGIM Secretariat no later than 29 June 2015.
