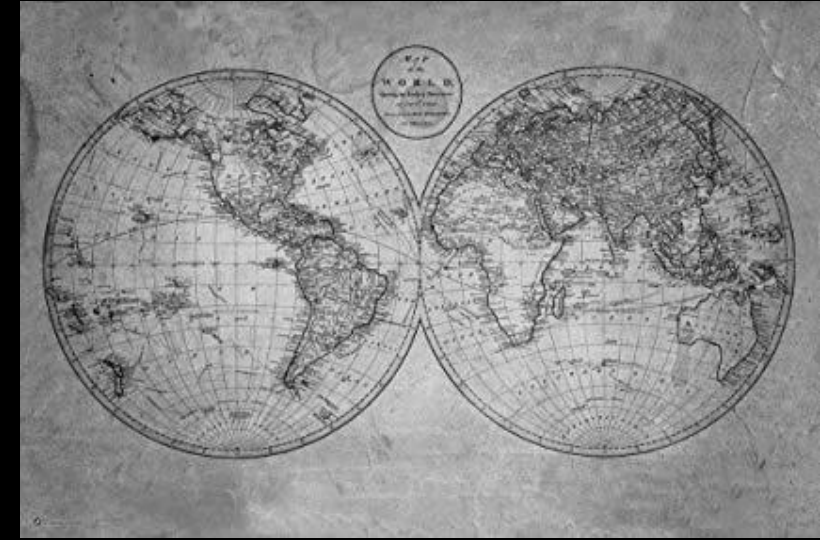
This segment seeks to review the Working Group's work plan and its activities, the progress to date, the achievements and any concerns



Work plan for 2018 – 2019

The Working Group agreed to its work plan for 2018 – 2019 at its second virtual meeting cognizant its primary objective is to ensure from a statistical and geographic location perspective, the key principle of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, to leave no one behind, is reflected in the global indicator framework.





Work plan for 2018 - 2019

In its work plan, the Working Group will focus and seek to –

Provide expert advice and guidance to IAEG-SDGs, and the larger statistical community as to how geospatial information, earth observation and other data sources can reliably and consistently contribute to the production of indicators;

Provide national and regional experiences and good practices including case studies in geospatial data generation to monitor “leaving no one behind”;

Propose strategies for undertaking methodological work on specific areas for improving disaggregation by geographic location. In particular with a focus on national and sub-national reporting, in this regard, to report to the High-Level Group, Statistical Commission and Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management; and

Review options and provide guidance to the IAEG-SDGs on the role of National Statistical Offices in considering and applying geospatial information and earth observations primarily as a means to contribute to and validate data as part of official statistics.
