Inter-Regional Committees Meeting 7 November 2023 Discovery Kartika Plaza Hotel, Kuta – Bali, Indonesia



- to strengthen inter-regional engagement and sharing of information including regional activities, case studies and webinars; keep respective web-sites of regional committees up-todate and provide web-links to all other regional committees;
- consider inter-regional cooperation including 'bilaterally', i.e., between two regions, aiming at enhancing national geospatial information management and data integration for evidence-based policy-development and accelerating the achievements of national development goals and the SDGs.

A meeting of Presidents and Chairs of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management Regional Committees for Africa, Americas, Arab States, Asia and the Pacific and Europe

Two Decisions:

- to meet, in-person, at least twice a year. Once at the annual sessions of the Committee of Experts each August at UNHQ, and the other, to be hosted by a regional committee, on a rotational basis, during its annual plenary meeting.
- 2. beginning with the fourteenth session, to coordinate the preparation of their joint report to the Committee of Experts under agenda item 4 Contribution of regional committees to the global geospatial information agenda. In this regard, UN-GGIMAP will take the lead for the fourteenth session and thereafter, by another regional committee, again on a rotational basis.

TERMS OF REFERENCE 2022 - 2025

- □ Adopted during the Executive Board Meeting in Singapore, March 13th, 2023
- □ The UN-GGIM-AP continues supporting Member States in advancing the operationalization of the GSGF and IGIF.
- Main Activities:
 - Coordinating, guiding and taking the lead in the work and activities of UN-GGIM-AP working groups;
 - 2. Coordinating and facilitating joint activities with UN-GGIM for the furtherance of its program of work;
 - 3. Planning, coordinating and convening annual plenary meetings of UN-GGIM-AP;
 - 4. Planning, coordinating and convening annual meetings of the Executive Board;
 - 5. Preparing reports to sessions of UN-GGIM and plenary meetings of UN-GGIM-AP.

RESOLUTION OF THE 12th UN-GGIM-AP PLENARY MEETING (NOVEMBER 2023)

- Recognizing the need for short-, medium- and long-term plans and strategies
 to raise awareness, including at the political leadership level, about the
 United Nations Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (UN-IGIF) and
 its components at regional and country levels using different means;
- Recommends the Secretariat to further support geospatial and statistics communities to enhance their collaboration and exchange for the effective implementation of the United Nations Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (UN-IGIF), and the Global Statistical Geospatial Framework (GSGF) to support sustainable development in the region, as well as encourage exchange and collaboration with other regional committees;



RESOLUTION OF THE 12th UN-GGIM-AP PLENARY MEETING (NOVEMBER 2023)

The IGIF Working Group will:

- a) Share experiences and best practices to assist in preparation of countrylevel action plans;
- b) Prepare UN-IGIF component-specific plans for understanding and implementation;
- c) Conduct trainings and actions for capacity and capability development with a special focus on the requirements of developing countries;
- d) Work on Adoption and Monitoring Mechanisms;
- e) Organize workshops, webinars, and meetings to deliberate and exchange ideas and experiences.


