








Technical Training Locations

1. Gusunituba Women Group: Votua Village, Ba (Completed in July). Included women from neighbouring villages.






2. Daku Women Group: Daku Village, Tailevu. (Completed in October) Included women from Kaleli and Anitioki village.















Maps – Votua, Ba






Maps – Kaleli, Tailevu






Maps – Anitioki, Tailevu
