

- 36 out of 48 sharedboundaries are under treaty(75%)
- **7 treaties remain** to be brought into force (yellow)
- 12 shared boundaries remain to be negotiated (pink)
- 5 high seas limits have yet to be declared (white)

### **Extended Continental Shelf:**

 3 out of 17 ECS submissions has been recommended (15 remaining)



**Global EEZ** 

(I2NM), to exclusive economic zones (200NM), to extended continental shelf areas, these zones determine what it is within the sovereign rights and responsibilities of a country under the UN Convention of the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

Clearly defined maritime zones underpin the governance, peace and security, marine conservation, and natural resource management of the Blue Pacific. By defining and declaring their maritime zones, Pacific island countries are contributing toward Strategic Priority I of the Pacific Cosanscape Farmework as well as achieving Sustainable Development Coal Target IAC-enhancing the conservation and sustainable use of coasens and their resources by implementing UNCLOS.



The National Territory of the Federated States of Micronesia is established in its National Constitution, which states: "The territory of the Federated States of Micronesia is comprised of the Districts of the Micronesian archipelago that ratify this Constitution. Unless limited by international treaty obligations assumed by the Federated States of Micronesia, or by its own act, the waters connecting the islands of the archipelago are internal waters regardless of dimensions, and


