


Our first webinar







Webinar discussion outcomes

The recurring theme was how do we get to the people who actually have the money – the decision makers within government and overseas aid agencies.

Coordinating between geospatial agencies within countries can be difficult but it is essential to enable a coordinated approach.

Within Europe there is already a lot of work that has been done in relation to spatial data infrastructures, but IGIF still has a place in helping to identify and then fill any gaps that may exist. As such it is still a useful tool for everyone.

Associated Needs

Clarity of the activity as a priority at the global level.

Links to a wider discussion about how to keep documents up to data and relavent. Especially when it relates to a topic that is as important as funding.

We need active engagement in the workplan of the UN-GGKIC so that we know what the Centre can do to support Member States.

This will avoid duplication of efforts at the global and regional level.

Associated Needs

It is hoped that this activity is already in progress, but there is lack of awareness at the operational/regional level which causes some concerns.



Understanding of how the HLG-IGIF sets and shapes the context and the activities for the UN Global Geospatial Knowledge and Innovation Centre, (the proposed Geospatial Information Ecosystem Centre) and how these are support existing regional priorities making sure all Member States benefit.

Associated Needs

Coordination between HLG-IGIF, UN-GGKIC, Regional Groups.



Analysing the results of the survey and enlarge understanding how IGIF is being used.

Also of interest is to see if the use has changed since issuing the survey.

Supporting Member States to develop the socioeconomic justification ("Business Case") for investment.



Associated Needs

Analysing capacity from working group IGIF Europe

Associated Needs

- Activity could be included as a work item as part of the Sustainable Funding Working Group.
- This is a different from funding for UN-IGIF implementation and should be a precursor to the investment process.

Reflection that the UN-IGIF is a tool for national [geospatial] development.

Make sure that we start to discuss the benefits of the UN-IGIF outside the geospatial domain.

Increasing the pool of experts who can contribute to the tasks of HLG-IGIF this could include a focus on regional priorities, concerns and opportunities.



Associated Needs

Shaping the messaging from a communication and engagement point of view, with a strong link to the Strategic Framework 2025-2030 as to not leave the UN-IGIF as a tool in isolation.
