Health and Safety

Adequate medical facilities are available to address any health-related needs. Ensuring the safety and well-being of all participants remains our utmost priority.

Weather

The temperatures in Saudi Arabia in February are comfortable with a low of 68°F/20°C and a high of up to 89°F/31°C.

There is little to no rain in Saudi Arabia during February, so it's a lot easier to explore the city. Just remember to dress in warm layers, as it can still get pretty chilly.

Currency and banking

The Saudi Riyal is the currency of Saudi Arabia. It is abbreviated as SAR, or SR (Saudi Arabian Riyal/Saudi Riyal). It is subdivided into 100 halalas. The currency is pegged to the US dollar at a constant rate of exchange.


All major international debit, credit cards and Apple Pay are accepted and can be used for transactions.

Telephone communications, mobile telephones and Internet

Most international mobile service providers operate seamlessly in Saudi Arabia, offering coverage for visitors. Additionally, new SIM cards are readily available for purchase at the airport and at outlets of mobile service providers across the country.

Electricity

Saudi Arabia uses power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type C, and G. The standard voltage is 220 V.
