Statement:

Mexico agrees that the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (IGIF) can be implemented in different ways in each country. However, in our experience, the regulation of its use is fundamental. In Mexico, the Law of the National System of Statistical and Geographic Information establishes that the Geostatistical Framework is part of the information infrastructure of its four Subsystems of National Statistical Information; Demographic and Social; and Government, Public Security and Administration of Justice. Likewise, it defines which are the minimum groups of data that each National Subsystem must generate.

The foregoing has allowed the generation of statistical and geographic information attached to a common spatial reference framework.

At the international level, the group of experts should continue with the guidance and push of the IGIF, which allows the application of homogeneous criteria on which statistical information can be associated, for example, the result of the censuses or the indicators for the measurement of the SDGs.
