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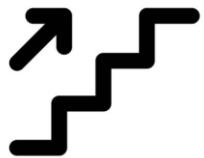
Translation of UN-IGIF Documents

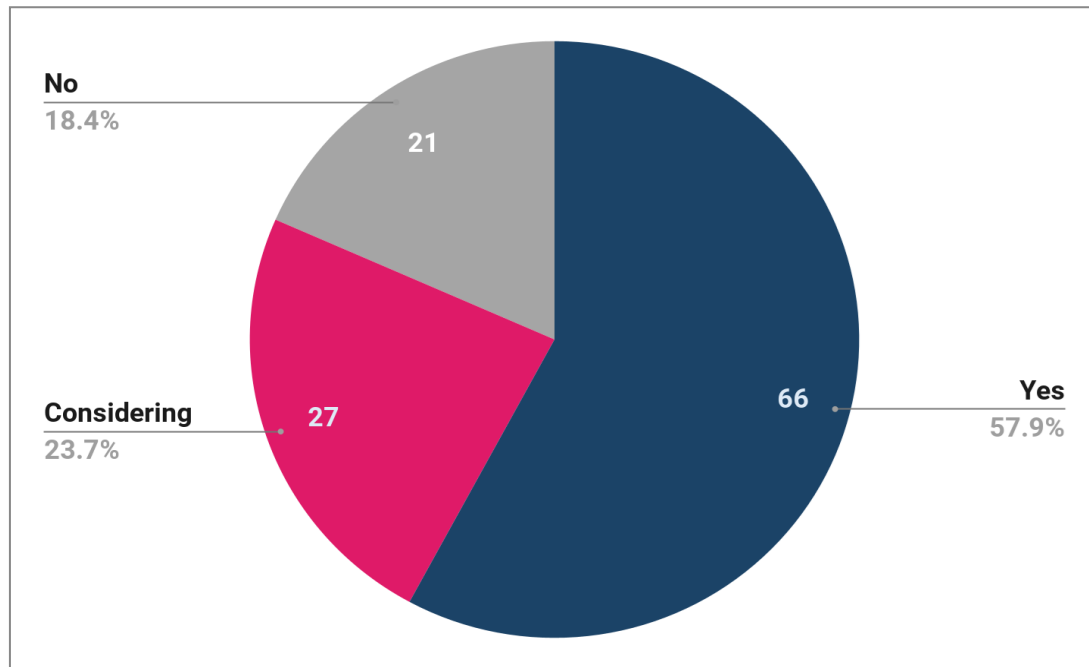

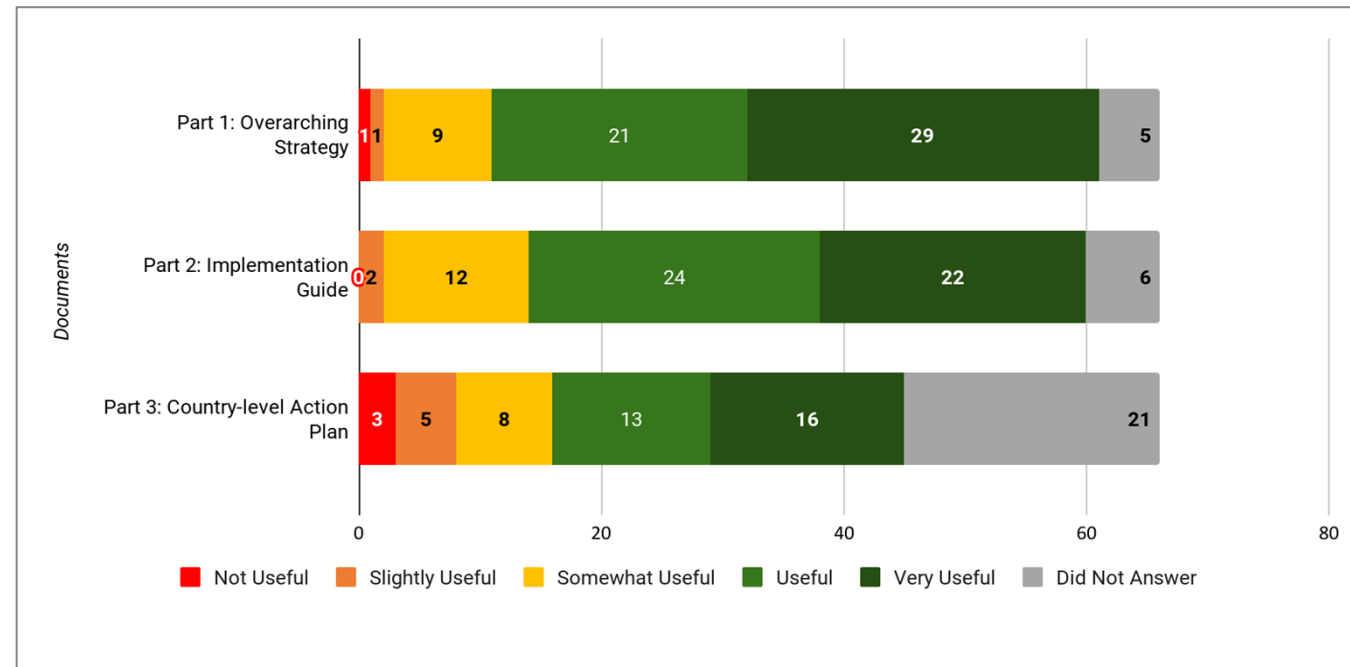

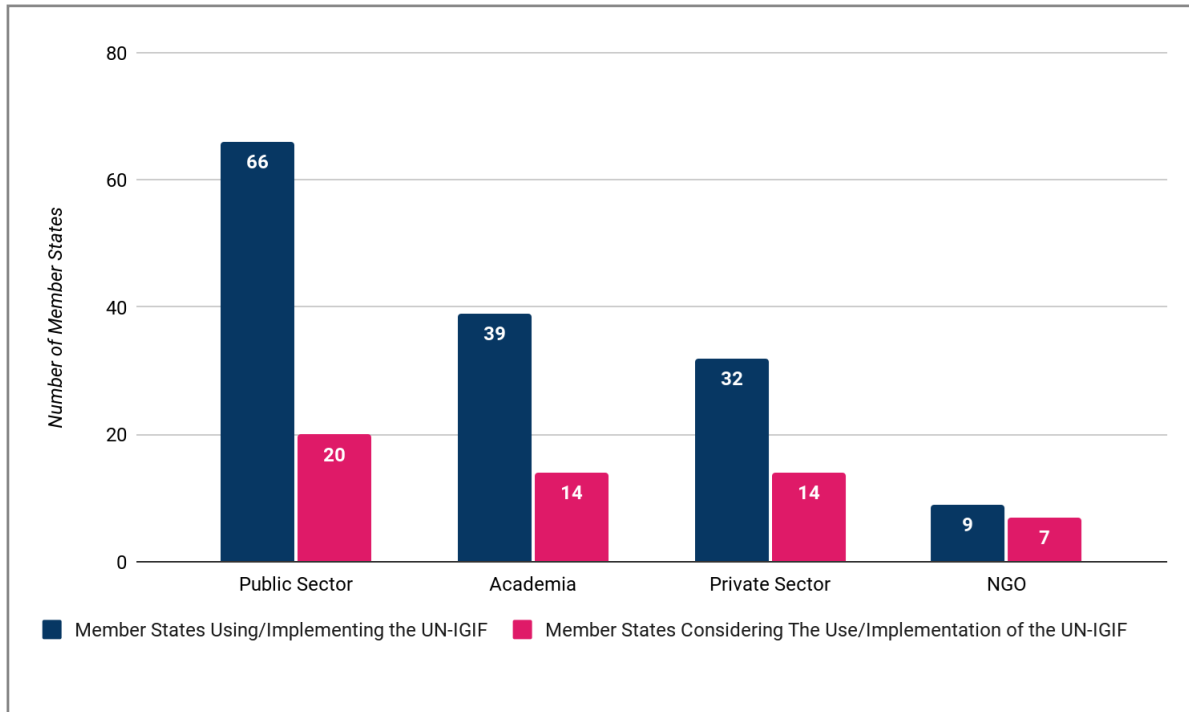


Usefulness of Each Part of the UN-IGIF By Member States Implementing It

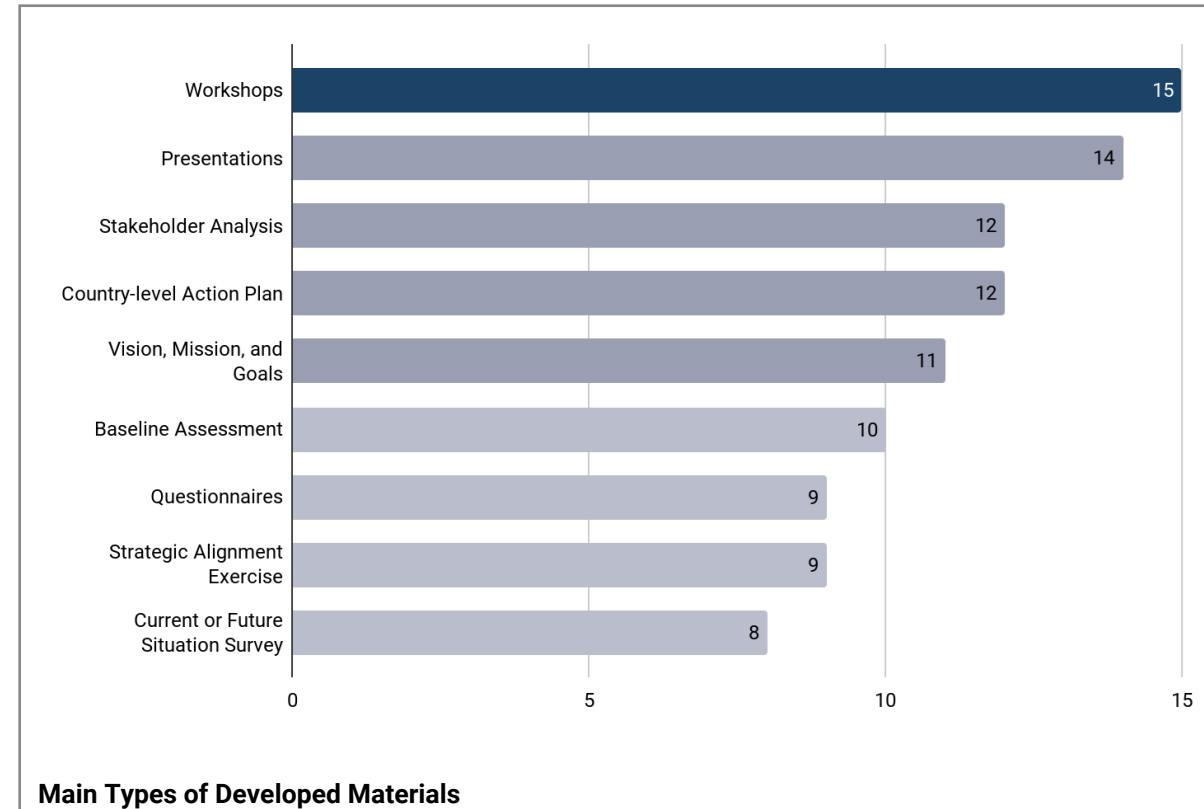

Preliminary Conclusions

- Survey as a powerful tool for understanding the use and implementation of the UN-IGIF.
- Results contribute to the strengthening of the Action Plans.
- Survey as instrument for identifying implementation cases of the UN-IGIF.
- Participation of all stakeholders to deepen the analyses.
- Survey should be repeated every two years, considering:
 - a. Collective construction.
 - b. Assessment of the UN-IGIF documents' usefulness.

Development of a methodology for cataloging and publishing collected materials.



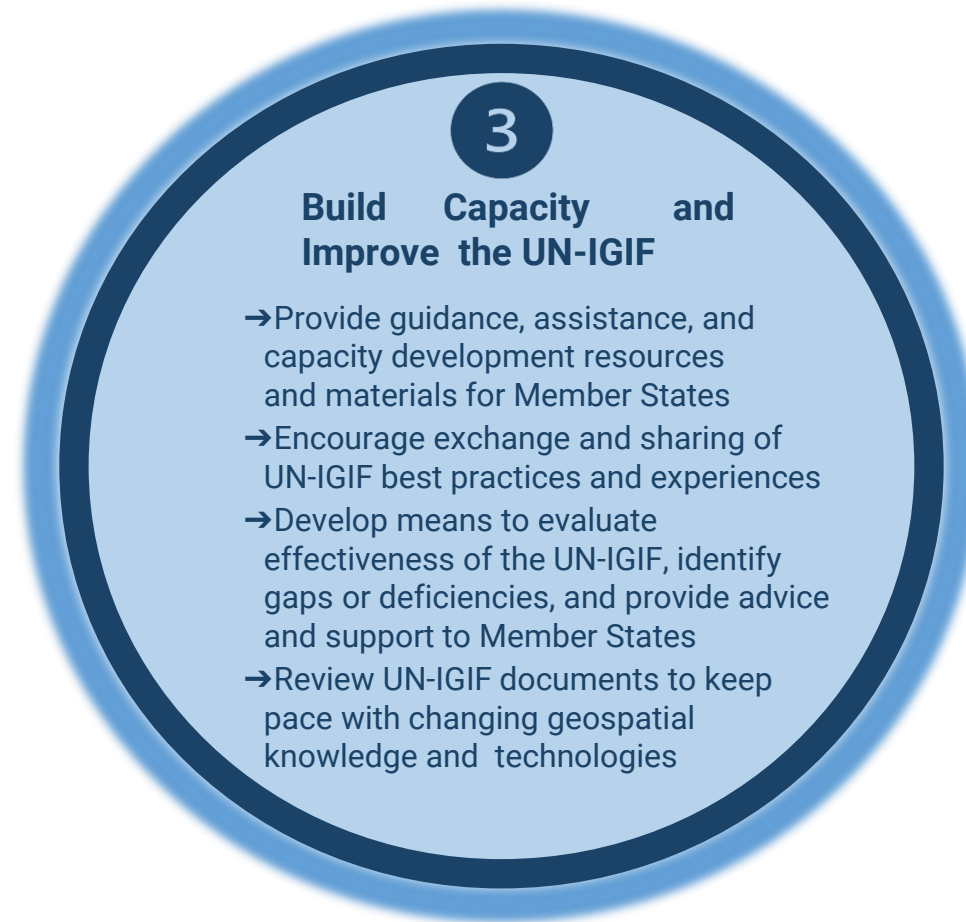
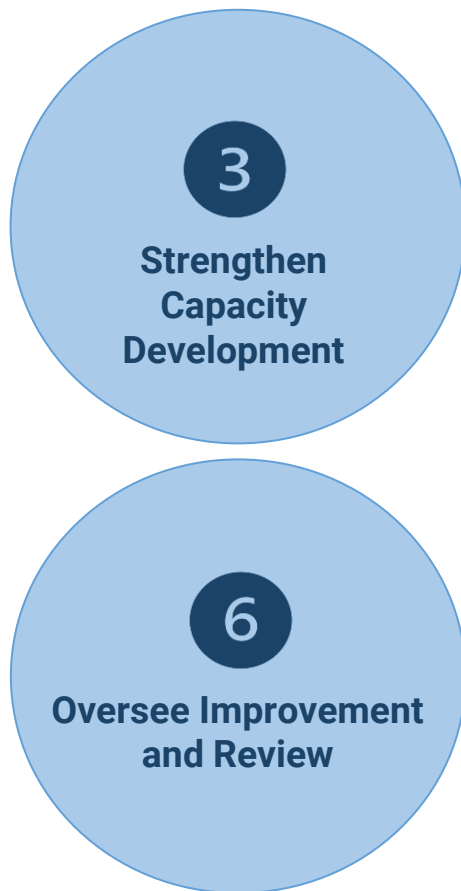

Focus Action 3: Develop means to evaluate the effectiveness of the UN-IGIF, identify and understand gaps or deficiencies in its use, and provide advice and support to Member States in evaluating its effectiveness.

Contribute to regular surveys in collaboration with actors promoting the implementation of the UN-IGIF.

Focus Action 4: Periodically review UN-IGIF documents to keep pace with changing knowledge and technologies regarding geospatial information and its evolution.
