#### **Background**

Many Member States are now developing IGIF Country-level Action Plans in order to address increasingly complex national, regional, and global challenges and to support the 2030 Agenda and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and other global development agendas.

Thus, this side event will highlight key achievements, address significant challenges, and explore future directions in geospatial information management, focusing on how integrated geospatial information can create a better future. It will showcase the transformative impact of global geospatial frameworks in areas like land administration and marine geospatial information, presenting real-world examples and best practices that enhance decision-making and implementation of the UN-IGIF.
