Fifteenth session of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) New York, 6 – 8 August 2025

I am pleased to inform you that the fifteenth session of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) will be held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from 6 – 8 August 2025.

In fulfilling its mandate, the Committee of Experts continues to provide the leadership to ensure that geospatial information and resources are coordinated, maintained, accessible and able to be leveraged by Member States and society to find sustainable solutions for social, economic, and environmental development. The annual session is the forum for coordination and dialogue with and among Member States and relevant international organizations on enhanced cooperation in the field of global geospatial information management. At the fifteenth session, the Committee of Experts will follow up and deliberate on work items from the fourteenth session including the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals, the implementation of adopted global geospatial frameworks, the United Nations Integrated Geospatial Information Framework in particular, and to strengthen and ensure its continued effectiveness and benefits to all Member States. The fifteenth session will address efforts to enhance the arrangement of the Committee of Experts as a subsidiary body of the Economic and Social Council in charge of all matters related to geospatial information, geography, land administration and related topics. It will also address emerging and critical issues including the future geospatial information ecosystem, climate, environment and resilience, and legal and regulatory issues related to emerging technologies.


