

Programs at a Glance - GWF 2026

- Architecture, Engineering & Construction (AEC): Supports SDG 9 & 11, with smart infrastructure and green design contributing to resilient cities and reducing 37% of global construction-related CO₂ emissions.
- Climate Resilience & Disaster Management:
 Advances SDG 11 & 13, with early warning systems and geospatial risk mapping reducing disaster-related deaths by 65% since 2000 in high-risk regions.
- Agriculture: Tied to SDG 2 & 15, the sector employs 27% of the global workforce, with geospatial tools enhancing yield, soil health, and sustainable land use.
- **Health:** Promotes SDG 3; geospatial and data-driven solutions help track disease outbreaks—e.g., satellite data supported 70+ countries in managing COVID-19.
- Capacity Development: Supports SDG 4, 8 & 17; with over 50% of the global workforce requiring upskilling by 2025, geospatial education and training build institutional resilience and empower informed decision-making.
- Utilities & Network: Contributes to SDG 7,9 & 11 by enabling access to clean energy, optimizing power grids, and enhancing service delivery through spatially enabled asset management systems.
- Hydrography: Supports SDG 14 & 9; with 71% of the planet covered in water, hydrographic data informs marine ecosystem protection and resilient infrastructure.
- Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DE&I): Aligns with SDG 5 & 10, as inclusive policies foster equal opportunity—yet women still represent only 28% of the STEM workforce globally.

Geospatial World Forum will spotlight discussions across the sectors mentioned above & more—showcasing how geospatial technologies empower these sectors in accelerating progress toward the UN Sustainable Development Goals.
