Creation of the "New" UNGEGN Economic and Social Council Resolution 2018/2, 10 November 2017

The resolution - Future organization and methods of work of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names

- Discontinues the UNCSGN and the UNGEGN in their current format.
- New body named the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names
- The new UNGEGN will convene biennial sessions, over a period of five days, beginning in 2019
- Has full authority to set its strategic direction and adopt resolutions to be submitted to ECOSOC
- The elected Bureau of the Group of Experts is to oversee the 2017–2019 transition

New Rules of Procedure and Draft Agenda

- On 24th July 2018 at its 51st plenary meeting ECOSOC adopted UNGEGN's Draft Rules of Procedure and Draft Agenda.
- This ECOSOC resolution completes a series of tasks which achieves the objective of creating a new agile, efficient and more effective body.
- UNGEGN has now consolidated its structure and reduced the number of meeting days, resulting in cost savings and efficient decision making and implementation practices.

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES

- 1. Continue to support the UN-GGIM WG on Fundamental Data Themes
- 2. The creation of a liaison group
 - develop a SMART plan for collaborative engagement
- 3. UN-GGIM experts contribute to UNGEGN's WG on Toponymic Data files and Gazetteers
- 4. Work jointly to encourage and communicate the benefits of geographical names standardization and the importance of creating names authorities/committees



FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES

- Regional collaboration support UNECA's Geonyms project to create a web based geographical names gazetteer for African Member States.
- Explore with the support of the Academic Network strengthening the infusion of toponymy/geographical names education in GIM university programmes
