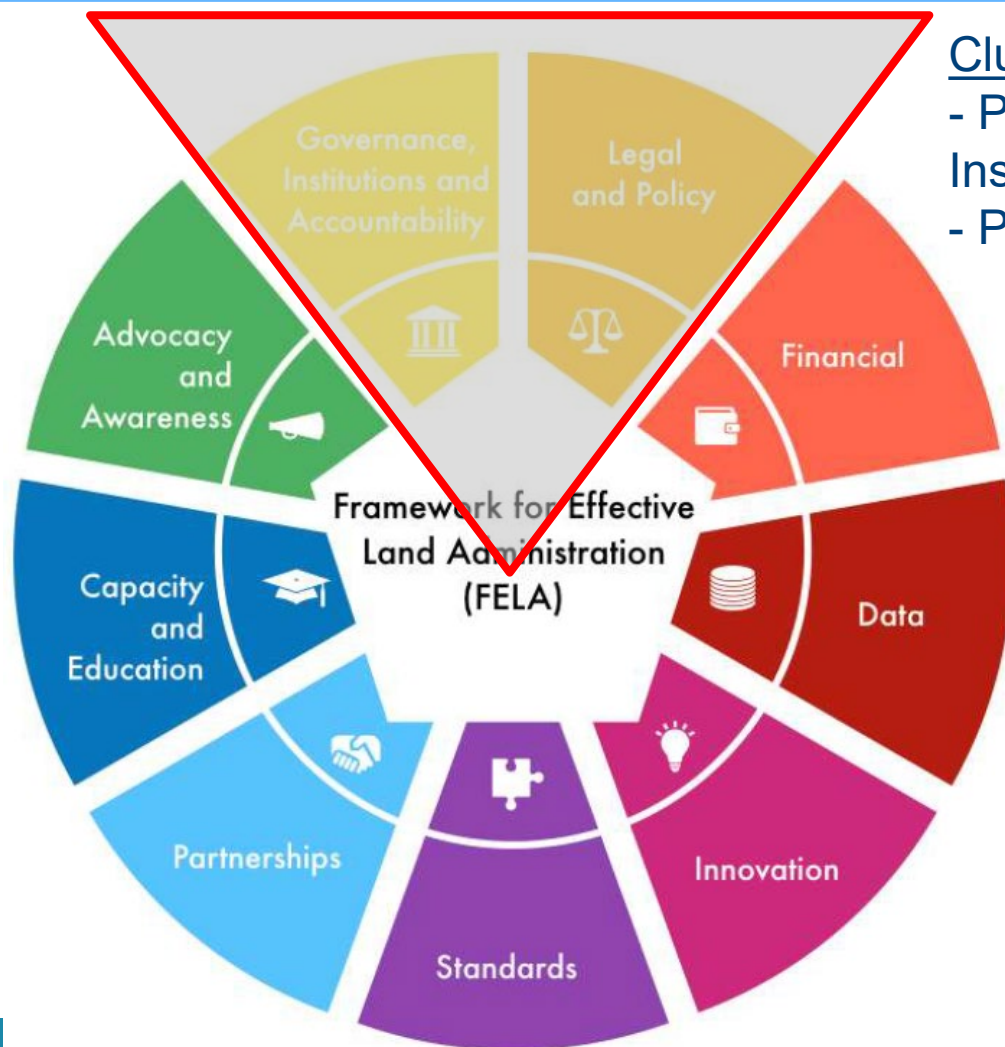

Pathways of the Framework for Effective Land Administration



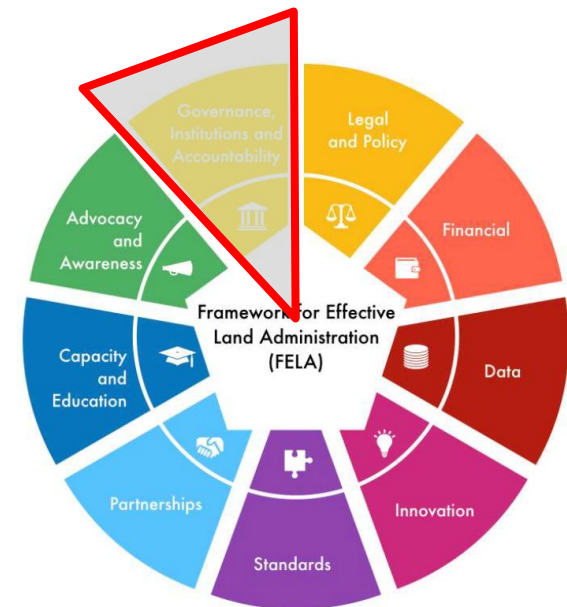

Institutions and Leadership

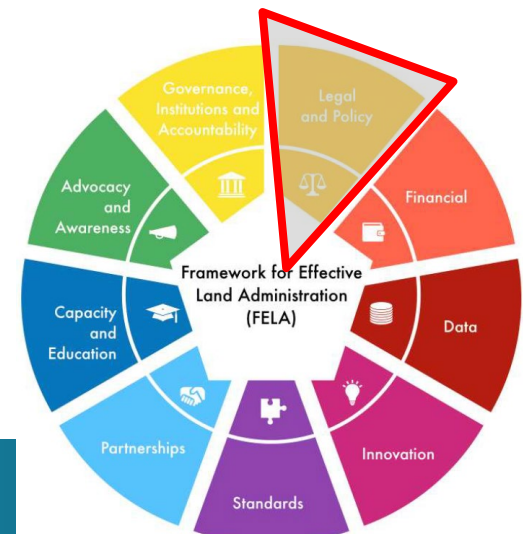
- Importance of attaining political endorsement and strengthening institutional mandates
- Role of actors from all sectors in Leadership
- Enabling environment for development of policies, standards, and regulations



Legal and Policy

Land Administration often finds its basis in land law and policy

- Mandates within national or state land laws, land policy frameworks
- Recognition of the dualist and pluralist nature of Land Administration Systems
- Creation of sound legal and policy framework relating to land tenure, use, planning and development

Legal and Policy



Land policies

- To be driven by responses to social, economic and environmental needs
- Holistic land policies based around sustainability
- Whole-of-government nature of land administration
- Promotion of land information sharing
- Promotion of local level empowerment in land policy design
- Active role of local governments in land policy development
- Integration of land policies across and between levels of government
- Inclusion of incentive schemes

Legal and Policy



Land legislation

- Inclusive, participative and transparent policy creation should drive legislative design at national levels
- Establishment of laws and regulations supporting institutional cohesion
- Application of good governance principles
- Local level empowerment in land law development
- Promotion of innovative use of technology and alternate tools
- Accountability embedded into legislation
- Consideration of data privacy and licensing issues

Legal and Policy

Implementation of policy and laws into practice

- Decisions are driven by rule of law
- Statutory law: Only one way to achieve effective LA-change
- Effectiveness and efficiency of community awareness and information provision
